### SWIM 4 LIFE

It's that time of year again; we are offering the Swim 4 Life program to families in need during the April 2018 school holidays. **Children must be at least 4 years of age to attend.**

The program will run from 2 pools, Lakeside Leisure Centre Greenway and CISAC Belconnen weekdays **from the 16<sup>th</sup> of April to 27<sup>th</sup> April 2018.**

*\*\* Note that there are no lessons on the 25<sup>th</sup> of April due to ANZAC day.*

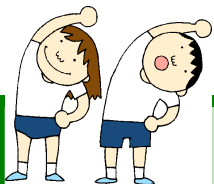
CISAC will run from 12.15 – 3.15, LLC from 12.30 – 3.30 in half hour sessions.

**Monday the 23<sup>rd</sup> to Friday the 27<sup>th</sup> of April 2018** will be held at a different aquatic location, for children attending Lakeside LC they are to meet at Pine Island 10 mins prior to their class time. If they are at CISAC they will be going to Lake Ginninderra, meeting at the western foreshore on Kate Pl (off Coulter Drive). We feel that this is a vital part of the program as most of the drownings that occur in Australia are in inland water ways. More information is provided in the attached letter to parents.

The program as usual is free to those families in need, who would normally not be in a position to afford to send their children to swimming and water safety lessons, who may be in foster care or are new residents to the country.

Attached to this newsletter is an enrolment form for families to fill out; they are to specify their preference of pool as well as the nominating organisation. This helps us with our reports at the end of the program.

**All forms must be returned by email at the latest Wednesday 4th April 2018. Spaces are limited to 80 enrolments** (40 positions per location).



### WORKOUT WEDNESDAY

Workout Wednesday is starting next Wednesday the 7<sup>th</sup> of March at 8:00-8:40am and it will continue every Wednesday morning thereafter. Workout Wednesday is a Fundamental Movement and Bodyweight Exercise class open for all year groups. The class will be run by a parent who specialises in bodyweight exercises and physical movements. Mr. Robinson will also be at every session to assist and supervise.

If you would like to attend all you need to do is collect and complete a permission note from the front office and come on Wednesday morning to the school hall at 8:00am with a water bottle and a change of shirt (wear an exercise shirt and bring your school shirt to change into afterwards).

### STUDENT INJURY

#### Insurance and Ambulance Transport

The Education Directorate does not provide any insurance cover for injury, disease or illness to students resulting from school activities or school-organised excursions. Claims for compensation are met where there is a legal liability to do so. Liability is not automatic and depends on the circumstances in which any injury, disease or illness was sustained.

As there is no automatic insurance cover for personal injury if your child is injured at school or during a school organised activity/excursion you should therefore consider whether taking out personal insurance cover for your child is warranted.

This insurance might cover contingencies including medical/hospital expenses, ambulance transport outside the ACT, and cancellation of transport/accommodation or loss of/damage to luggage.

The ACT Ambulance Service provides free ambulance transport for students who are injured or suddenly become ill at school or during an approved school organised activity within the ACT.

### MEDICAL INFORMATION AND CONSENT FORMS

The Excursion Medical Information and Consent forms that are presently being returned to the front office are to be kept on file for future excursions incurred within the ACT.

For excursions that occur outside of the ACT we will be requiring an additional Medical Information and Consent form each separate excursion.

For example, Year 5 and 6 will be receiving a new Medical Information and Consent form tomorrow for an excursion outside of the ACT which will need to be completed and returned by 23rd March.

Should there be any changes in your child's medical conditions or medical action plans we will require a new updated form to reflect these changes.
